The purpose of this workshop is to provide an opportunity for the public to comment on the proposed amendment to the master plan before its adoption by the Board of Trustees. The master plan describes the projected growth for the University of Florida main campus and 13 Alachua County satellite properties for the next 10 years. This plan focuses on the areas of land use, transportation, housing, capital improvements, conservation, recreation, infrastructure, utilities, urban design and academic facilities.
